Faculty Fellowship for Leaders in Collaborative and Humanistic Interprofessional Education

The **Faculty Fellowship for Leaders in Collaborative and Humanistic Interprofessional Education** aims to build enduring trusting relationships among interprofessional education (IPE) faculty leaders at 7 national sites including Boston Children's Hospital /Harvard Medical School. These leaders will serve as collaborative role models committed to creating successful strategies to educate others about humanism and to developing future generations of IPE leaders.

At each site, a group of 8 – 10 education leaders from at least three professions will participate in ongoing IPE faculty development sessions. Each site will plan and implement a humanistic IPE project at their institution.

The program at Boston Children's /Harvard is unique in that we have developed a faculty fellowship, rather than just providing a seminar. We are also the first site to implement and adapt the curriculum for pediatric and adolescent medicine faculty.

Benefits for Participants:

- Gain expertise in interprofessional collaboration and humanistic health professions education with a committed cohort of interprofessional colleagues
- Join a community of 8-10 faculty education leaders from at least three professions
- Meet twice/month for 1 ½ hours (October/November through May/June). To be scheduled with cohort.
- Enhance teaching skills and role modeling overall, and in interprofessional education/teaching, teamwork, humanism and professionalism
- Enhance reflective capacities and the ability to use these in teaching
- Become part of a national alumni group of faculty that is participating this project
- Plan, implement and evaluate an interprofessional humanistic education/practice group project
