ACCREDITATION

Joint Accreditation

In support of improving patient care, Boston Children's Hospital is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME), the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE), and the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) to provide continuing education for the healthcare team.

Physicians

Boston Children's Hospital designates this live activity for a maximum of 7.5 AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™. Physicians should claim only the credits commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

- Risk Management Credits: This activity meets the criteria of the Massachusetts Board of Registration in Medicine for risk management study and is eligible for 7.5 risk management credits.
