## Faculty Fellowship for Leaders in Humanistic Interprofessional Education

The **Faculty Fellowship for Leaders in Humanistic Interprofessional Education** aims to build a collaborative, humanistic (meaning guided by the humanistic values of respect, service, compassion, integrity, honesty) group of clinical and educational leaders from different health professions, who will come to know and respect one another, and will enhance their teamwork, communication, professionalism and teaching capacities. These leaders will serve as collaborative role models committed to creating successful strategies for promoting humanistic values in learning environments and organizational cultures at their institutions.

A group of 8 – 10 education and clinical leaders from at least three professions will participate in ongoing IPE faculty development sessions, and implement a humanistic group IPE project.

The program at Boston Children's Hospital /Harvard Medical School is unique in that we have developed a faculty fellowship, rather than just providing a course.

### *Benefits for Participants*

- Gain expertise in interprofessional collaboration and humanistic health professions education with a committed cohort of interprofessional colleagues
- Enhance teaching skills and role modeling overall, and in interprofessional education and collaboration, teamwork, communication skills, humanism and professionalism
- Enhance reflective capacities and the ability to use these in teaching
- Build a community of faculty education leaders from different healthcare professions
- Meet twice/month for 1 ½ hour sessions (March 2018 – November 2018) plus several IPE group project meetings. To be scheduled with cohort.
- Become part of a national alumni group of faculty participating this project

- Appreciative inquiry/Narrative reflection
- Identifying and sustaining core values
- Highly functioning teams
- Advanced team formation: Dealing with differences & conflict
- Error disclosure and team formation
- After the error: Learning, growth, and wisdom
- Interprofessional education
- Through the patient's eye: Empathy
- Giving bad news: A teaching exercise
- Promoting diversity and inclusion
- Well-being and renewal
- Mindfulness
- As a group, plan and implement an interprofessional humanistic education/practice project

## Research Component

As the curriculum is part of a national 7-site project, fellows will participate in evaluation of the curricula by completing several short surveys and reflecting on their learning over the course of the fellowship.

We are applying for continuing education credits. Certificates will be provided to those completing the fellowship.

The tuition is \$2500. We anticipate most participants will receive support from their departments and/or will utilize conference, departmental, or personal professional development funds.
